Monday 18th February

Tuesday 19th February

A selection of Welsh Ambassadors have planned and prepared a Welsh lesson to support transition for Welsh with some of our feeder primary schools. Today these pupils are representing our school at St. Marys and St. Anne's Catholic Primary schools. They will be teaching Welsh lessons to Year 6 pupils.

Wednesday 20th February

Session 2 – 7 Romero and 7 King will be taking part in a Twmpath Dawns in the Gym. Mr Sammons has been preparing dawnsio gwerin/folk dancing for the event with Year 7 pupils. The Urdd will be taking a session with both classes this lesson with the help of Mr Sammons. Pupils are to drop their bags off in session 4 and then head to the Gym.

Dinner time – Staff are invited to join in with some dawnsio gwerin!

Session 4 – Year 9 pupils and the Welsh Ambassadors are attending a Welsh Gig with a question and answer session funded by the Urdd. Daniel Lloyd is a Welsh actor and musician who was brought up locally and now lives in Denbighshire. Daniel has been in a Welsh band for a number of years and he has also been in a number of productions including productions on the West End and Theatre Clwyd. Pupils are to drop their bags off in session 4 classrooms and then head to the Gym with their class teachers.

Thursday 21st February

Sessions 2 – 5 pupils in Years 7 and 8 will be taking part in the school Eisteddfod in the Gym. The Welsh ambassadors will be helping during the event and will help to judge some competitions. The ambassadors have also prepared a quiz for the event. During the day we will also be holding a Chair Ceremony for the Chief Bard. Please can year 7 and year 8 pupils liaise with their form tutors to leave their bags at the back of their form rooms.

Assemblies all week

Assemblies - All week the Technology department will be leading the assemblies on the theme of St. David with the help of the Welsh Ambassadors. All pupils and staff will receive a bookmark to note the occasion. On the front of the bookmark are the words of St. David and on the back are Welsh idioms/words of advice to help improve your Welsh work.
