School Asthma Card

Pupils have been advised that if they have been diagnosed with asthma they must collect a school asthma card from reception to give to parents / carers to complete. Once completed and signed the form must be returned to reception **no later than Friday, 14**th **October**.

This card will then be held by the school. It should be reviewed once a year and updated or exchanged for a new one if your child's treatment changes during the year.

Please ensure medicines and inhalers have the pharmacy label attached showing the child's name and dosage and hand to reception.

Service Children and Families

Welsh Government regularly ask us to update our register of 'service children' in order to ensure that they receive any information and support that may be relevant to them.

A 'service child' is defined as:

Definition 1 (Welsh Government definition)

A 'Service child' has parent(s) – or person(s) with exercising parental responsibility – who is/are Service personnel serving:

- in HM Regular Armed Forces
- in full commitment as part of the full-time Reserve service
- is a veteran who has been in Service within the last two years
- One of their parents died whilst serving in the Armed Forces and the pupil receives a pension under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme or the War Pensions Scheme.

Definition 2

A person whose parent, or carer, serves in the regular armed forces, or as a reservist, or has done at any point during the first 25 years of that person's life. *and does not meet the criteria of definition 1.

If your child meets either of the definitions above, please log into *Edulink* and navigate to the menu button 'Forms' and complete the online Children of Service Personnel form. Please respond as soon as possible and no later than 31st October 2022.

SSCE Cymru works collaboratively with organisations across the UK to build an evidence base that impacts policy and systems.
