Edulink App and ParentPay Login Details

Label Everything! (and Lost Property)

We are already finding items of uniform around the school site. In most cases items have no name on them. I know that you will have spent significant amounts of money on school uniform/kit. We can help return items if they contain the pupil's name. I would recommend labelling everything – it's amazing what gets left behind! Any items of lost property are collected and made available each half term for parents/carers to look through. Pupils can do this daily by asking at reception.

Traffic and Parking

We are experiencing problems with traffic congestion on Sontley Road after school with cars parking on both sides of the road and opposite the school entrance. This adversely affects the flow of traffic on Sontley Road and blocks the area for buses leaving school premises.
